



Stefan de Jong

Assistant professor. Erasmus University Rotterdam. The Netherlands.

Stefan de Jong is an assistant professor at the Department of Public Administration and Sociology of Erasmus University Rotterdam and a research fellow of the Center for Research on Evaluation, Science and Technology of Stellenbosch University. At Erasmus University Rotterdam, he is a member of the university-wide strategic project 'Evaluating Societal Impact.' Prior to his current affiliations, Stefan was a post-doctoral researcher at the Department of Sociology of the University of Chicago and the Manchester Institute of Innovation Research of the University of Manchester, and a researcher at the Rathenau Institute of the Netherlands Royal Academy of Arts and Sciences. Stefan also has experience as an impact and grant adviser at Leiden University. Additionally, he is the founder of Engaging Scientists. He has hosted over 50 impact workshops in the Netherlands and abroad and has trained over 800 researchers and professional staff so far.

Stefan obtained a BSc. in Cell Biology from Wageningen University, an MSc. in Innovation Studies from Utrecht University and a PhD in Social Sciences from Leiden University. His dissertation 'Engaging scientists: Organising valorisation in the Netherlands' focuses on the relationship between Dutch impact policies and academic impact practices. His research interests include societal impacts and evaluation of academic research and professional staff of universities. Stefan has authored fifteen scientific publications on these topics, as well as six policy reports and briefs, and several blog posts, including two posts on the widely read LSE Impact Blog. He has received several grants, including from the Dutch Research Council (Rubicon Grant in 2017) and the European Commission (Marie Skłodowska-Curie Fellowship in 2020).
